

Landlubbers Loop

The landlubbers loop is about 1km all on bitumen pathways and suitable for beginners. It is scooter and training wheel friendly.

1. Head towards the big signpost which says "Welcome to Kuljak Island", what is the 3rd picture from the left? _____
2. Carry on via the bitumen path down the hill, when you get to the bottom, you will see a drain. How many bollards are protecting the drain? _____
3. At the intersection take the right fork, but remain on the bitumen path. Soon you will see a small garden with a sign. Which Perth suburb is involved in the revegetation of the area? _____
4. Ride past the turn off to the gazebo and keep going. You'll come to an intersection, go straight (don't go downhill here!) The path will do a big wide turn to the left. At the furthest part of the turn is a strange object that does not belong. What colour is it? _____

5. Carry on along the path and keep right at the next intersection. You'll come to a big enclosure. Count the fence posts. _____

6. Ride on until you get to a gazebo. Count the planks while you enjoy a break. _____

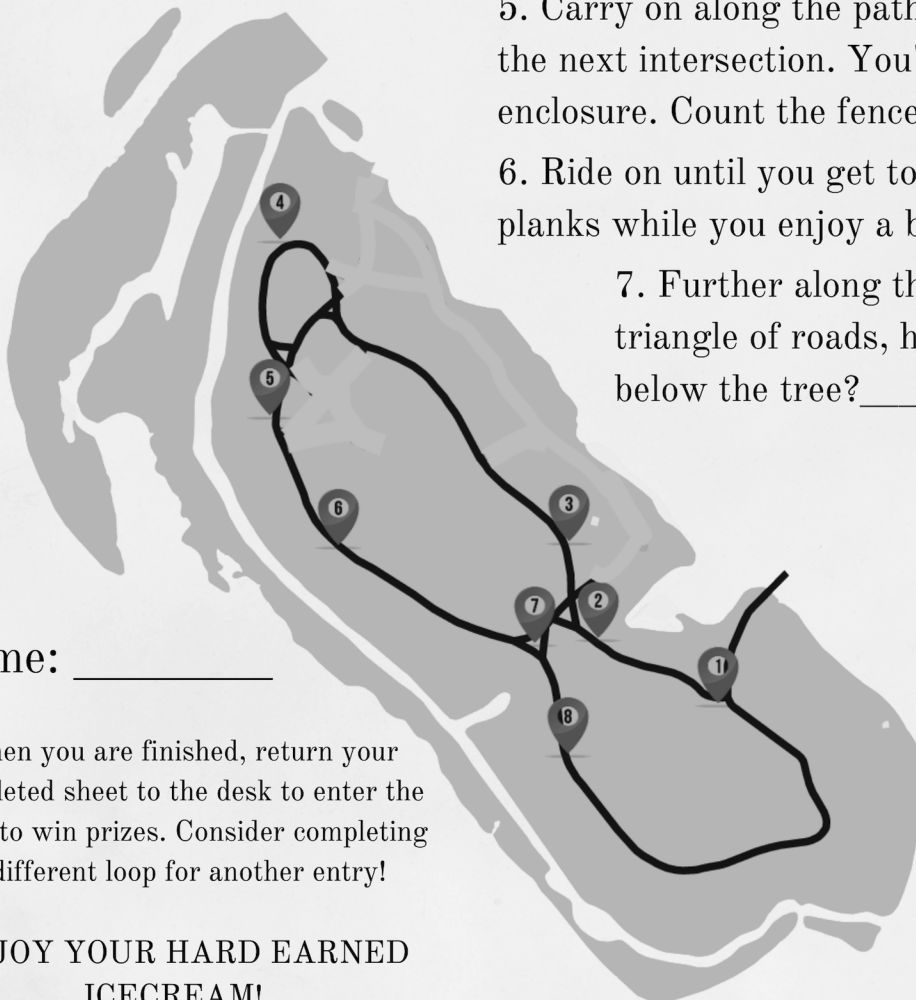
7. Further along the path you'll find a triangle of roads, how many palms are below the tree? _____

8. BONUS: If you have the energy, ride to the top of the next hill, look around. What are the 2 colours that make up the big tower in the distance? _____

Walk, Ride or Scoot the Planks

'Walk, Ride or Scoot the Planks' is a 2km long treasure hunt trail. It crosses 4 bridges and 1 public road. Suitable for scooters and trainer wheels, but the bridge in question 3 is only for experienced bike riders.

1. Head down hill on the bitumen path. Stop at the fork in the road. Look at the sign about dogs. What kind of penalties apply if you don't follow the rules? _____
2. At this intersection, take the left fork and then the right fork at the next intersection. You'll be riding towards a large tree. What colour is the bark? _____
3. Keep riding on the bitumen path past the gazebo. On your right, you will come to a wooded area with gravel paths.

OPTIONAL - only for experienced riders! Practice your skills riding back and forth across the bridge in the wooded area. Which of the following bike skills helped to get over the bridge? ____

- a) both pedals level
- b) eyes ahead
- c) elbows out
- d) bum off the seat
- e) all of these skills

4. When you're done with the bridge go back to the bitumen path and over to the big caged area. What are the 3 numbers next to the A on the skip bin? _____

5. Continue on the bitumen path and take the right fork at the big bush. Now, keep going straight on the bitumen path, you will go down a hill. **Be careful** on the hill as the 'Shiver Me Timbers' hunt trail crosses here. At the bottom of the hill is a bridge. What should you NOT do from this bridge? _____

6. Cross the bridge - what lives here? _____

7. Turn right to ride on the concrete pathway with the river on your right. Ride along and count how many green posts are beside the concrete path. _____



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8. In the middle of this bridge is a rest area. Read the 2 signs about birds and reptiles. Which is the only herbivorous bird displayed? _____ Which bird has a yellow eye ring? _____

9. Carry on along the pathway. There are more green posts. Count these until this concrete pathway ends. How many are there? _____

You have reached the end of this treasure hunt. Take care to cross the road then turn right to cross the bridge and continue up the hill and back to the registration tent.

SHIVER ME TIMBERS!



This hunt is mostly on gravel pathways through the shady wooded area of the island. It is a 4km long loop. The questions below correspond with the numbers on the map.

To find the entrance to the gravel pathway, follow the bitumen pathway down the hill, when you come to an intersection, turn left, then turn left again at the next intersection. Keep going on the bitumen up the hill and around in a big circle back to the other side of the car park area.



1. At the entrance to the gravel pathway, look at the big signpost which says "Welcome to Kuljak Island", What does Kuljak mean?

2. Follow the gravel pathway down the hill. Stop at the gazebo. Look across the river. What indoor activity can you see? _____

3. Carry on along the gravel pathway keeping the river to your left. Soon you will see a shipyard across the water. What colour is the roof of the shipyard? _____

4. Continue on the pathway, in this section you'll come across some intersections, stay left. You'll see a park bench. Take a rest. How many screws are on the bench? _____

5. From the bench follow the path around the small inlet. On the other side of the

inlet there is a picnic table. What material is it made of? _____

6. Continue along the gravel path with the river on your left. Eventually there will be a fence between you and the river. What two materials is it made of? _____

7. As you continue along the path you'll come to a low gate. Do not enter here. Turn sharply right and head toward clue number 7. You will cross a pathway made of another material. What is this material? _____

8. Continue on the gravel, you may be able to spy the river on your left through the bushes. You will get to a badly graffitied bench. What does the blue graffiti say? _____

9. You are almost done! Take a rest on the jetty benches and count how many poles are holding up the bridge across the river? _____

To get back to the start, follow the gravel path up the hill, when you get to the bitumen turn left and follow the bitumen path back to the start.
